CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS OR VOLUNTEERS

Roles and Responsibilities of Staff and Volunteers in school or on trips

- The code of conduct ensures that respect for the individual is maintained at all times and that neither peers nor others expose the pupils to risk of physical, sexual or emotional abuse or harassment.
- Adults should behave in a reasonable manner in all circumstances, so that the personal safety and well-being of those in their care are not jeopardised during the visit.
- > Safety of children is of PARAMOUNT IMPORTANCE at all times.
- Assisting adults should follow the instructions of the Teacher in Charge and other staff and help with control and discipline.
- They should speak to the Teacher in Charge if concerned about the health or safety of the young people at any time during a visit or in school
- > On trips, adults will be assigned approximately two children each to accompany and care for during the trip (one child per adult for children with special needs).
- Adults must ensure that they hold the hands of each child while walking along paths, and keep close to their assigned children and watch them at all other times.
- > Adults must ensure that they **keep together** as a group and not stray too far behind or ahead of the party at any time.
- Accompanying adults are responsible for helping their assigned children to do up coats, put on hats, gloves etc as necessary and to assist with giving out, or opening snack items.
- If bus travel is included, adults must ensure that only one child is placed on each seat, and put on seat belts where they are available. Adults should sit on the aisle side of a bus seat where possible.
- Parent volunteers will <u>not</u> be left in sole charge of a group of pupils <u>nor</u> <u>should they accompany any child to the toilet other than their own</u> <u>child</u>.
- First Aid will be administered by Nursery School staff or employees as appropriate to the location of the injury.
- Smoking, drinking and use of illegal drugs or mind altering substances is strictly <u>forbidden</u> during any school visit.
- > Adults and pupils should demonstrate appropriate **relationships** amongst their peers and any other party that they may come into contact with.
- > Adults should ensure the **security** of their own personal belongings.

- Adults and children should display acceptable manners and general behaviour thereby promoting enjoyment by all.
- > Adults should ensure equality of opportunity for all.
- > Under no circumstances should persons other than official group members join the party.
- Where appropriate, accompanying volunteers will be subject to a Police Vetting procedure being carried out and approval gained before participating in the trip.

The school has the right to refuse any pupil or adult from participating in the visit/trip, whose involvement may be considered to be a danger to him/herself or to the group.
